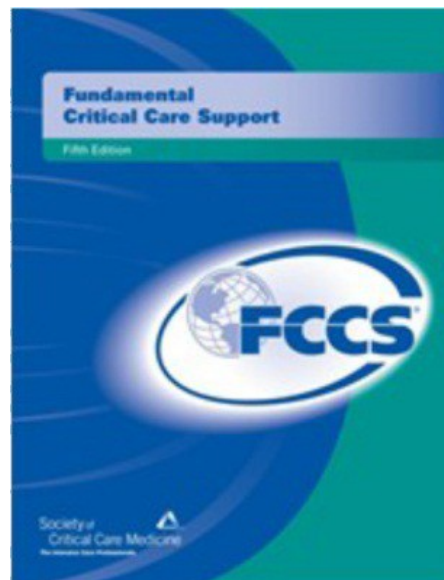

Part I: FCCS Online Course Enrollment

Follow the instructions provided below in order to create your Society of Critical Care Medicine account and enroll in the FCCS course.

1. If you've clicked or copied and pasted the link provided above you should now be on the Society of Critical Care Medicine Web site where you can begin to create an account.
2. Create your Customer ID and logon information – see Figure 1 below for reference.

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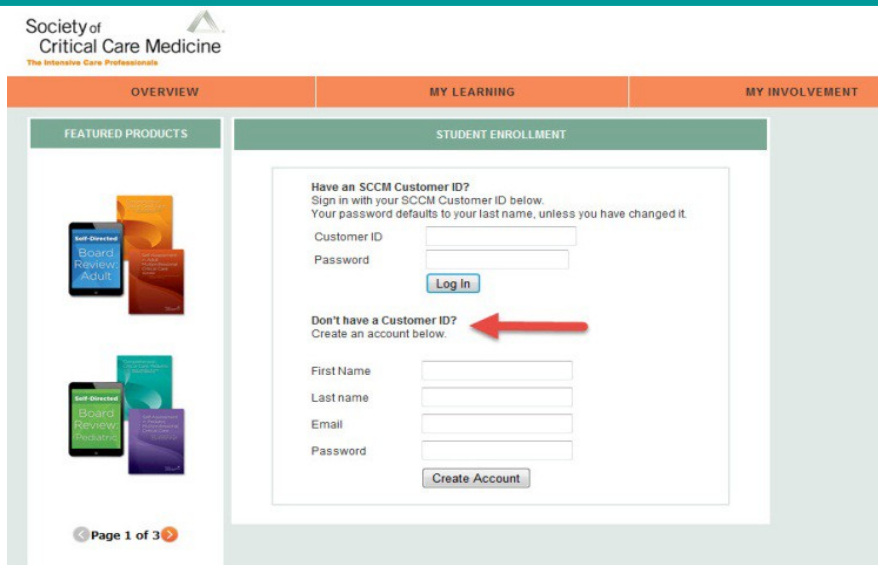

- To continue with your course enrollment, click on the link highlighted by the red arrow and text box shown in Figure 2 below.

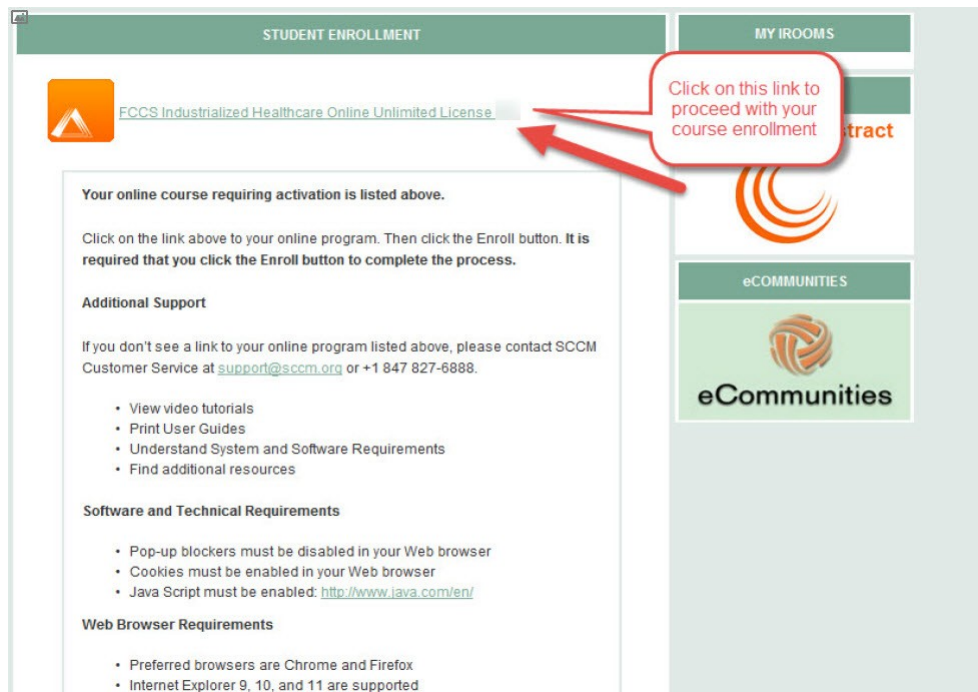

- When you click the link you will be directed to the page shown in the Figure 3 below. To **finish** the enrollment process, click the **Enroll Now** button as shown in Figure 3.

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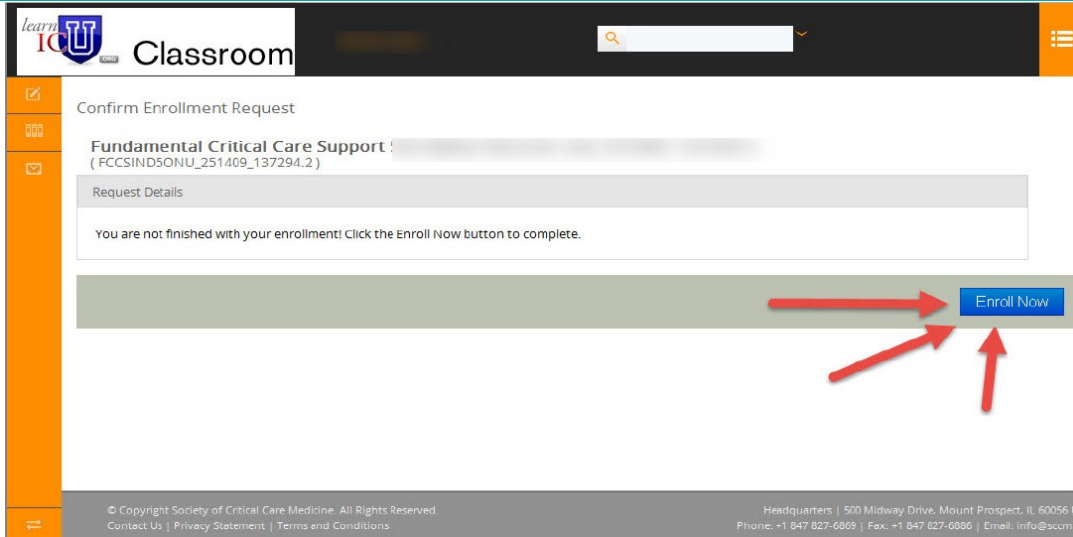

8. You will now have access to the course under the **MY LEARNING** tab that is located on your Society of Critical Care Medicine profile page. See Figure 4 below for reference.

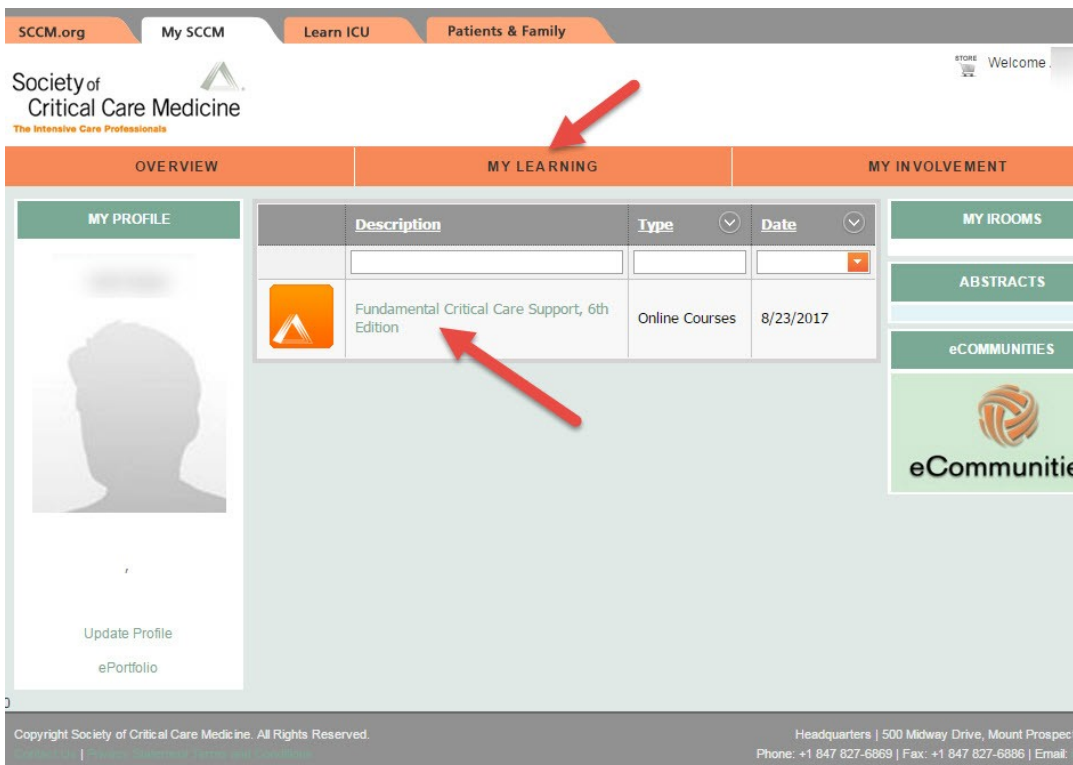

Fundamental Critical Care Support (FCCS)
